Child Safeguarding Statement

Section 1 – name of club.

Dun Laoghaire Chess Club is located at 3 Eblana Avenue, Dun Laoghaire (the premises of the Eblana Club).

Section 2 – nature of services being provided.

Our club convenes on Wednesday evenings at 7:30 for designated Club Nights. Club Nights provide the main forum for all members (including junior members) to participate in chess activities. Club members also participate in Leinster league matches with other clubs at home and away. The vast majority of our members are adults and are male. We do not have a junior section, nor do we offer organised coaching to children. That said, junior members are welcome to join our club. We typically only have a very small number of junior members from time to time (in or around 5 on average). The few junior members who join our club tend be talented and ambitious in their chess, and normally keen to play for us in the Leinster league.

Section 3 - Risk Assessment

We have carried out an assessment of any potential for harm to children while attending our club. Below is a list of the areas of risk identified and details of how that risk will be managed.

The Parental Responsibilities Form will require parents to commit to liaising with the Designated Person in order to arrange a plan for the safe arrival and departure of the young person from
